Exciting News

Inspired by a testimony given by a missionary at SIM, Serving in Mission, last summer, we began to explore the needs of a missionary school in Bolivia that is short on teachers. After a lot of prayer and research, we determined that God is calling us to minister through teaching at this school in Bolivia. SIM has invited us to take positions at Carachipampa Christian School at the high school level. We are very excited to see how God will use us there.

Carachipampa Christian School

Carachipampa Christian School (CCS) was founded in 1926 to serve children of missionaries, but now is also open to children from local Bolivian homes. CCS:



- Provides a quality education for the children of missionaries and for children from local Bolivian homes.
- Is responsible for the education of over 200 students with satellite schools in Sucre and La Paz

Cochabamba and Bolivia

Bolivia is the landlocked "heart" of South America. It became independent from Spain in 1826. Bolivia is one of the least developed countries in South America. Almost two-thirds of its people, many of whom are subsistence farmers, live in poverty.

As the Bolivian Indian Mission (BIM), SIM first entered Bolivia in 1907. SIM Bolivia's vision is that by the year 2010 there will be a strong evangelical church in Bolivia constituting 30% of the population. SIM's role in bringing about a mature church in Bolivia is through leadership development.



Cochabamba, where CCS is located, is the third largest city in Bolivia (~800,000 people). It is located in a valley of the same name in the Andes mountain range.

Our Ministry

As was mentioned before, we will be teaching at Carachipampa Christian School. Both of us will be teaching at the high school level. The school has expressed needs in many subject areas.

Brandon will be fulfilling a need for a math and science teacher. He is very excited to be getting a chance to explore the career of teaching as well as getting the chance to minister through the school setting.

Being in a Spanish-speaking country, the school does not have an immediate need for a Spanish teacher. Therefore Jamie could possibly be fulfilling a position as an English or social studies high school teacher. However, her Spanish skills will become helpful when communicating and ministering to natives in and around the Cochabamba area.

Both of us are very excited to have the opportunity to minister to our students as well as the natives of Bolivia and even missionaries that we will be working with.

Our Needs

Our biggest need is always **prayer**. With the prayer of our family and friends surrounding our ministry, God will be able to use us in ways that we never imagined. With your prayerful support, all things will come together according to God's will for us.
